Texas Ordinary Certificate of Acknowledgment

This Ordinary Certificate of Acknowledgment, as prescribed by the Texas Civil Practices and Remedies Code, Section 121.007, may be used when an individual is signing and acknowledging on his or her own behalf. The optional section at the bottom can deter alteration of the document or fraudulent reattachment of this form to an unintended document. Failure to fill out this section will not affect the validity of the certificate.

Instructions:

- **1 NAME OF COUNTY** where Notary performs notarization.
- 2 NAME, TITLE OF NOTARIZING OFFICER. For example, "Amy Smith, Notary Public" or "John Doe, Judge."
- **3 NAME OF SIGNER** appearing before notarizing officer. Initials and spelling of name should agree with name signed on document and ID card. Line through any remaining space.

4 TYPE OF IDENTIFICATION.

Check first box if signer is personally known to notarizing officer. Check second box if signer is identified by credible witness personally known to Notary; also, write in name of witness. Check third box if signer is identified through ID card or document; also, describe ID (e.g., "Texas Driver's License expiring 1-30-20.").


5 DATE OF NOTARIZATION.

Actual day, month and year in which signer appears before notarizing officer.

6 SIGNATURE OF NOTARIZING OFFICER. For a Notary, the name signed must be exactly the name appearing on commissioning papers and in seal.

7 NOTARY SEAL IMPRINT,

clearly and legibly affixed, if a Notary is the notarizing officer.



SPACES 8-11 ARE OPTIONAL.

Omission of information here will not affect the document's validity. However, completing these spaces can deter alteration of the document or fraudulent reattachment of this form to an unintended document.

- **8 TITLE OR TYPE OF DOCUMENT** notarized, such as "Grant Deed."
- DATE OF DOCUMENT
 notarized. Most but not all documents will have a date, usually at the top or following the signature. If none, insert "No Date"
- **NUMBER OF PAGES** in the notarized document. This may point out fraudulent addition or removal of pages. Do not count the certificate as a page. However, the certificate will be regarded as a page by recording officials in assessing recording fees.
